Mosaic aims to:

- ✓ Improve communication within the family giving them a greater understanding of how to support each other in their grief and so reduce the isolation so often felt during bereavement
- ✓ Improve the self-confidence of the young person and their ability to have fun without guilt or anxiety
- ✓ Understand and manage difficult emotions and communicate their needs
- ✓ Attain academic achievement that is appropriate for their age and ability
- ✓ Establish a greater social network of supportive peers
- ✓ Provide the opportunity to meet others and share their experiences making them feel supported
- ✓ Offer training to schools and other professionals who support children and young people

✓ Support the children and young people at our Residential Weekends

25 children and young people come to our weekends which are held at Leeson House, Swanage. The weekend gives children and young people the opportunity to meet others, share their experiences, remember their special person and most importantly 'HAVE FUN'. The volunteers who help at the weekends, attend our in-house and safeguarding training.

✓ Help at fundraising events

We have a team of volunteers who sell items and raise awareness of the charity at craft fairs, help at our own fundraising events and organise events themselves.

✓ Help in the office

An extra pair of hands in the office is always welcome. Sending out newsletters, checking and organising resources for the weekends etc. are just some of the ways you can help.

All our volunteers have DBS (Disclosure & Barring Checks) before working with the families.
